Come along to help restore and maintain the Londonderry Woodland Reserve, a vital remnant of the critically endangered Cumberland Plain Woodland. This is a very special site as it contains mature, large trees and a creek which provide habitat and migration pathways for wildlife. It's the closest experience you can have to being in the Cumberland Plain prior to European Settlement!

Where: Londonderry Woodland Reserve

When: 1st and 3rd Sunday and most Thursdays every month

What: As part of a Cumberland Plain woodland corridor, the restoration and maintenance of this site are paramount to the preservation of this unique and beautiful ecological community, so come along, have fun and get involved in planting, trees, shrubs and grasses, removing weeds, habitat improvement, flora and fauna surveys, bird watching and water quality monitoring. It is a great opportunity to learn about the flora and fauna of the Cumberland Plain Woodland.

Meet: 830am at Penrith Station or contact the office if you want to meet on site.

Essentials: You must wear sturdy boots, long pants, a long-sleeved shirt and a hat. Bring plenty of water and a good lunch.
